

ROSA PARKS INTERVIEW

Rosa Parks: I want young people to know that they have the power to make a difference, no matter their age. Each one of us can stand up against injustice in our own way, whether it's through speaking out, standing up for others, or simply treating everyone with kindness and respect.

Interviewer: That's a powerful message. Looking back, what do you hope your legacy will be?

Rosa Parks: I hope my legacy inspires others to keep fighting for equality and justice. I hope it encourages people to never underestimate the power of their actions, however small they may seem. And most importantly, I hope it reminds everyone that change is possible when we stand together.
